Teacher Salary 2022 Midterm Election Guide

(A Living Document/Draft-In-Progress)

Overview

As we enter the 2022-23 school year with deep and widespread teacher shortages, every candidate for public office should be campaigning for higher teacher salaries. This Election Guide is intended to educate voters as to which candidates at the federal and state level are doing so, and to encourage more candidates for elected office to do what three-quarters of the public wishes to see: teachers being paid a livable, competitive salary. The development of this guide was led by The Teacher Salary Project a non-profit, non-partisan, volunteer-run organization whose mission is to make teaching the prestigious, desirable, financially viable, and professionally exciting job we all know it needs to be.

How to use this guide

This Teacher Salary 2022 Election Guide is a living document, developed with the support of several dozen volunteers, and will be updated weekly up to the 2022 Midterm Elections. There are several notes users should consider:

First, note the default assumption is that candidates do <u>not</u> support professional teacher salary levels unless their campaign website or other online source clearly shows their support. We welcome any corrections to this draft of the guide; please send corrections, including a credible website link showing the candidate's clear support for higher teacher salaries, to <u>info@teachersalaryproject.org</u>. Candidates who have not yet campaigned for professional teacher salary levels can still do so at any point leading up to the November 8th, 2022 election, and we encourage constituents to invite them to do so (see sample language for your elected officials in Appendix A at the end of this document).

Second, we erred on including more candidates at the expense of more in-depth research on each. This guide is therefore NOT meant to serve as a list of Teacher Salary Project endorsements. A candidate may demonstrate support for higher teacher salaries but still not align with other core beliefs you hold and may even have complicated (or even objectionable) views on other elements of the education system. We therefore suggest using this guide as a data point in your research and

encourage you to engage in additional research before committing to a candidate. This may include consulting the election guide from the <u>National Education</u>
Association, or other guides that align with your priorities.

Third, note this is a nonpartisan guide and raising teacher salaries is a bi-partisan issue. As such, we intentionally did not include candidates' political affiliation in this guide. That said, given the very large number of candidates for some races and limited space and time, for the most part we only included candidates from the two major parties and only races that are contested. If you are a candidate not currently listed who wishes to be added, please email info@teachersalaryproject.org. Again, this is a living document which will be updated weekly until the Midterm elections.
